12.	Brief description of the activity	Health Camp			
		 With the help of office of District Magistrate North Deep has organised Health Camp in H Block Jahangirpuri Area on 19th February from 11 AM to 3 PM. This Health Camp started with the profiling of all the street situation children of H Block Jahangirpuri whom we have collected at the Health Camp site. 			
		 Doctors deputed from CDMO North started with the basic health check-up of these children. Which included their height and weight measurement, pulse rate and other check-up symptoms related to Anaemia, worms, general weakness, diarrhoea, upper respiratory tract infection, allergies, etc. 			

- After the check-up procedure the children were made to sit for receiving health related awareness from the doctors. The doctors informed them about Covid appropriate behaviour and health related precautions for Covid.
- At the end of this health camp the doctors distributed necessary medication to all the needy children and they also referred certain children for further reference related to their ailments.

Mental Health Counselling

As we all know that mental health is a global issue and in India it is mostly a neglected issue in society about which we usually don't talk. In view of this, Deep Welfare Organization organised a mental health session for the children in street situation because these children are completely marginalised and their basic needs are also being ignored so is their mental health. They are not aware about mental health and why it is an issue of grave concern. In this mental health counselling session, we targeted 93 children and we talked about problems they usually face and how these problems usually make them feel. We also talked about all the situations that cause them any kind of distress in their day-to-day life. Then we talked to them about approaches that can help them tackle these problems and solutions that can make them feel better and relaxed. After the end of

		this session, we distributed refreshments among all the children.

In this health camp we provided them necessary medications. We linked all these children to mental health counselling. We sent these children and their parents in convergence- cum-facilitation camp in CWC Alipur on 2nd February 2022. We are also taking regular follow up through our volunteers.
